Conservation Technician

This temporary, part-time position (999 hours max.) available at the Jamestown Wildlife Area directly supervised by Matt Farmer and Rob Unruh, Public Lands Managers. The incumbent will be involved in all facets of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Public Lands operations. Job duties include by not limited to; wetland management, prescribed burning, tree removal, sign maintenance, litter removal, cleaning rest rooms, mowing campgrounds and parking areas, control of noxious weeds, planting food plots, etc. Operation of a variety of equipment including tractors with agricultural implements (mowers, disk, planter), skid steers (with mulcher, mower, forks, etc.), hand tools, ATV's/UTV's, mowers and trucks with trailers. Incumbent will work part time (up to 40 hours) depending on the workload and scheduling.

BENEFITS: Hourly wage between \$10.15 and \$13.61 per hour depending on experience, education and abilities. Normal work week will be Monday – Friday (depending on scheduling and availability), 40 hours maximum per week. No paid holidays.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS: Must be physically fit and able to perform demanding tasks in a variety of outdoor setting and weather conditions. Required to be at least 18 years of age with a valid driver's license. Must be able to provide own transportation to and from work. Preference will be given to students working toward a natural resources degree.
