## **ERO No. 48**

This Executive Reorganization Order would relocate the state's Tourism Division to the Kansas Department of Commerce, and designate the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism as the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

This ERO was submitted by Governor Laura Kelly to the Kansas Legislature on Jan. 25, 2021. This ERO becomes effective on July 1, 2021, following its transmittal to the Legislature, unless within 60 calendar days of transmittal, either the Senate or House adopts a resolution disapproving it.

<u>This bill has a hearing scheduled for Feb. 11</u>, <u>2021 at 10:30 a.m. in Room 546-S</u>. The Department will provide testimony at this hearing in support of the ERO.

# HB2025

This bill would protect private property from unauthorized access by certain government officials and

This bill was prefiled on Dec. 31, 2020, and introduced on Jan. 11, 2021 and referred to the Committee on Agriculture. On Jan. 21, 2021, this bill was withdrawn from the Committee on Agriculture and referred to the Committee on Federal and State Affairs.

This bill had a hearing on Feb. 4, 2021. The Department provided testimony at this hearing with concerns that this bill could impact game wardens' abilities to investigate poaching, trespassing and other wildlife-related violations on private lands.

# HB2032

This bill would make the use of artificial light for the purpose of spotting, locating, or taking wildlife unlawful.

This bill is a response to action taken by the Kansas, Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Commission to allow the use of artificial light and thermal-imaging equipment when hunting coyotes at night.

This bill was prefiled on January 4, 2021, and introduced on January 11, 2021 and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

This bill would require coast guard-approved personal flotation devices as prescribed by the secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism in rules and regulations.

This bill was introduced on Feb. 4, 2021 and referred to the Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources on Feb. 5, 2021.
